# President's Message March 2022

#### **Dear Members**

There have certainly been changes to rules and regulations introduced by the Western Australian Government in the last few weeks in Western Australia because of the Omicron variant of COVID-19. It is terrific to see that the vaccination rates are continuing to improve all the time with people going and having a booster shot. With Novavax now available it is hoped that community members will ensure that they are fully vaccinated. There is now clear evidence that for most people who are fully vaccinated that if a positive Omicron test is received without having other health issues the virus is usually only a mild case and recovery happens quite quickly.

The approach to managing COVID-19 over the winter months must focus on minimising the health impacts with a particular focus on protecting those most at risk of severe illness. This year's winter season will likely see the co-circulation of COVID-19 and influzenza viruses which we have not seen significant transmission of since 2019.

The Federal Government is proposing to extend the concessional Rapid Antigen Test program until 31 July 2022 in partnership with the States and Territories.



Children under five, pregnant women, people 65 years and over, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and people with medical conditions that put them at greater risk of becoming seriously ill from influenza are able to receive their vaccines free of charge through the National Immunisation Program (NIP). The NIP offers a specific enhanced influenza vaccine to protect older people.

The Federal Government is investing additional funding in medical research to identify new and innovative approaches to help increase participation in Australia's breast, bowel and cervical cancer screening program. Bowel cancer is the third most common cancer in both men and women in Australia and is more common in people over the age of 50. The National Bowel Cancer Screening program has been rolled out nationally and has the potential to save 84,000 lives by 2040 if participation levels hit 60 per cent. Currently participation in the program remain below 45 per cent.

The University of Western Australia will undertake research to improve breast screening participation and target obesity related barriers to mammographic screening.

Research will also examine ways to engage Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women, women from diverse cultural and language backgrounds and women with different levels of education attainment and income.

A trade measurement audit program will be conducted in 2022 to ensure imported food and grocery goods measure up for Australian households. Where many of us prefer to buy Australian food and grocery items sometimes it is not possible. The National Measurement Institute (NMI) will conduct the audit concentrating on oils and seasonings, pet food, beverages sanitisers and cleaning products.

Obesity is a complex health condition. Australia's first National Obesity Strategy was recently released which will help people understand the social, environmental and economic factors which can impact a person's ability to maintain a healthy weight and in turn increase the risk of chronic conditions such as cardiovascular disease and type 2 diabetes. Making healthy choices is not always easy and the strategy recognises the importance of ensuring all Australians are empowered, enabled and supported to make the best possible decisions about their health.



A number of events were held again this year in Perth and rural Western Australia to celebrate International Women's Day. The theme this year was 'Break TheBias'- whether deliberate or unconscious bias makes it difficult for many women to move ahead. The WA Women's Hall of Fame held its annual Inductee Ceremony on Friday 4 March 2022 in the Government House Ballroom. The 2022 Inductees are listed separately in this Newsletter.

The WA State Government is delivering on its funding commitment to support women and children at risk of homelessness due to family and domestic violence. The Safer Pathways Program which has been expanded to cover Midland and Mirrabooka areas, has been servicing Cannington and Victoria Park catchment areas since 2016, helping women with or without children who are in public housing tenancies or waiting for a public housing allocation and are experiencing family and domestic violence.



Two concurrent and complimentary reviews will examine a multitude of issues relating to sexual offending to ensure laws and practices deliver justice outcomes to victim-survivors in Western Australia and adequately reflect community expectations. The Law Reform Commission of Western Australia will review the sexual offence laws contained in the Criminal Code and provide advice on possible amendments to enhance and update these provisions. The final report is due in July 2023.

The Department of Justice through the Office of the Commissioner for Victims of Crime will undertake a separate project examining the end-to-end criminal justice process for victims of sexual offending from reporting an offence to the release from custody of the offender. The Department of Justice will complete its review and provide the Government with its recommendations by May 2024.

A key commitment from the 2021 Women's Budget Statement abolishing the \$450 threshold limit for the payment of superannuation passed the Federal Parliament in February 2022.

From July 2022 around 300,000 Australians (about 200,000 of whom are women) are set to benefit from this provision. It means that these workers many of whom work two or more jobs will start receiving superannuation and have the same right as other workers.

Well over half of the Family Home Guarantees issued since the program commenced in July 2021 have been taken up by women. The program designed specifically to help single parent families, the majority of whom are women into the housing market has assisted more than 2300 single parents on the pathway to owning their home. Many of the guarantees issued have gone to essential workers like nurses and teachers.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to all in Ukraine. The bombing campaign on a maternity hospital in the besieged southern city of Mariupol is disgusting and a war crime without any justification. The world must stop Putin from continuing these horrific crimes. There must be a permanent ceasefire!
